Dear Friends of Aquinas & St. Mary's,

The Aquinas & St. Mary's Board of Advisors (formerly the Council of Administration) Finance and Audit Subcommittee recently met to discuss the 2017-2018 budget and five year budget forecast. We are continuing to work towards our strategic plan goal of achieving a more equitable mix of our revenue sources. As you can see from the "Funding at a Glance" sheet in this newsletter, our parish assessments continue to be the main source (58%) of our income. While we believe it is greatly important for our deanery parishes to be strong supporters of Catholic school education, as they have for many generations, we also think it is important that our tuition and fees revenue (18%) increase in part to more fair and just levels. At the same time however, we will NEVER turn away students from Aquinas-St. Mary's because of inability to pay; we will always work with families who have real financial issues and show a good faith effort to do what they can. We also have the wonderfully supported Guardian Angel program to assist such families who desire a Catholic education for their children.

Having said that, I think it is important to again look at the "Aquinas-St. Mary's Funding at a Glance" sheet that shows the comparison of nearby Catholic and private schools tuition and fees rates. Aquinas-St. Mary's is significantly lower (\$1,400) than Columbus Scotus (\$2,725), Lincoln Christian (\$9,180), and Norfolk Catholic (\$6,500), among others. Aquinas-St. Mary's provides an excellent education to the children of our parents, at a very low cost to them, especially considering that the total cost to educate each student is \$7,315.

If you get the feeling that we want and need strong support from both our parishes and tuition rates, you are right! We believe what the Catholic Church has always taught, that the mission of the Church is to teach the Gospel (Matthew 28:19), and that her mission is best executed in Catholic schools. There may be alternatives to Catholic schools, but there are no substitutes. Therefore, our parishes should always be closely involved in the support of Aquinas-St. Mary's, as it helps to ensure the Catholic faith is passed down from generation to generation. Similarly, parents should also have a strong stake in the education of their children in the faith, or "some skin in the game", so to speak, and a more balanced approach to our revenue sources will help to accomplish that goal.

Our parishes also need our Catholic school parents and all parishioners to be active and participating members in parish life. Being a disciple of Jesus Christ calls us to more than being registered and attending Mass on Sunday; it calls us to active stewardship. Prayer, volunteering, and financial support are integral to active stewardship. Regardless of your income level, everyone has a responsibility to support the ministries of the Catholic Church by tithing a certain percentage of your gross (before taxes) income. Our tithing to the Church is simply a recognition that everything we have is a gift from God; nothing is truly "mine". The Lord giveth, and the Lord taketh away. When we can view our money and possessions as simply a gift from God to help us be holy and get to heaven, we can better see that we have a NEED to give back something to Him. In other words, our giving to the church isn't because "the furnace is about kaput", or "we're behind on our bills", but because it is important that I visibly show my gratitude to God for His blessings. The Church has long taught that a good place to start is 5% to your parish, and 5% to your other favorite charities. Even if you think you cannot start at 5%, try even just 1%, and work your way up over time from there. Our giving to the church should be intentional (planned out/budgeted first), proportional (in comparison to other expenses) and sacrificial (trust in God to provide).

As we near the beginning of a new school year, we ask our Lord for His continued blessings and graces upon our Aquinas and St. Mary's Catholic schools, and all of our deanery parishes. God, in His loving providence, has always given us everything we need in order to run our Catholic schools well, and help parents form and teach their children. In our fidelity to Him, may he continue to bless us abundantly.


Aquinas & St. Mary's Funding At-a-Glance

Cost to Educate one student at Aquinas & St. Mary's





Tuition Comparison




Stewardship Model

Driving past Aquinas during these last few weeks may lead you to believe that the school pretty much closes down for the summer. Just a few cars are in our front lot and the school busses resemble hibernating bears just waiting for their August wake up call. It is a little more peaceful at school in the summer but there is still a lot going on.

Several faculty members are attending workshops or taking summer classes to enable them to better serve your students in the upcoming years. Education is like swimming, you can either tread water or swim towards shore. You have to keep working to learn and improve your educational skills.

We welcome Mrs. Rachelle Mayo to the Aquinas Family this year. Mrs. Mayo will be teaching middle school science and working with the Science Olympiad participants. We are very excited to have Mrs. Mayo with us. I believe she will be a great addition to the staff.

Miss Fiala will once again be with us in a somewhat limited capacity. She will be working with Fr. Timmerman and me in the office and I hope will be helping to maintain some of those special projects that made our middle school unique.

Please make her feel welcome. A new 2018, 65 passenger bus has also been added to the fleet replacing a 2000 bus that has served us well for a long time.

The students will notice a few renovations when they return in August. The cafeteria has gone through some renovations to create a little more space in the kitchen and make our serving line move more smoothly. We have added a few lockers to the girls' locker rooms due to the high number of participants in our activities programs. The new furnaces may not be visible but the students will hopefully appreciate the furnaces that were needed to replace those in the original classrooms of the school. The parking lot is also getting a little work to add a few more parking places in the corner of the lot southeast of the gym.

The gym floors have all been refinished; the classrooms and hallways are being cleaned and waxed. It won't be long until the peaceful pace of the summer is broken with the anticipation and excitement of the teachers and students returning for the new school year. Students will report for fall sports on August 7th. Faculty will report for three days of meetings and workshops on August 11th, and the students will return to the classrooms on August 16th.

Miss Fiala chose the following quote from Pope Francis for the month of August to welcome us back. "All together, then, we ask the Lord: launch us on the adventure of mercy! Dear Aquinas/St. Mary's Community,

We hope that your summer has been full of faith, family and friends. It will not be long, and we will be starting the 2017-2018 school year. **Classes will begin on Wednesday, August 16.**

Here is information for the first day of school:

- The **first school day** (August 16) will be a 1:20 dismissal for Aquinas and 1:30 dismissal for St. Mary's. Normal day is 8:00 – 3:15 for middle school (busses will leave Aquinas at 3:25 sharp), 8:00 -3:22 for high school students and 3:30 for St. Mary's students. The first day will include Mass. Busses will run and lunch will be served. Preschool (T/Th) will begin on 8/17 and Pre-K (M/W/F) will begin on 8/18.
 - Please see attached class lists. If any **morning T/Th preschool students** would be willing to switch to the afternoon, please let Jeri in the St. Mary's office know right away.
- **For St. Mary's, the K-5 students will wear uniform clothing the first day of school.**
- **For Aquinas, the first day of school will be a dress-up day because school pictures will be taken.** Sorry, no jeans or shorts please. The uniform shorts are the only shorts allowed. **Uniforms will be required, starting on Thursday, August 17.**
- **Bus drivers** will be contacting their riders in the next few weeks as to the time and locations of their stops. If you would like bus service and have not requested it for this school year, please call Aquinas immediately (367-3175). If you wish to ride the bus to Aquinas from St. Mary's in the morning, you should be at St. Mary's by 7:40 a.m.
- **All students in Pre-K through 12th grade** are required to provide the school with current immunizations records. Pre-K, Kindergarten and all new students to Aquinas or St. Mary's are also required to provide birth and baptism certificates.
- **Physicals booster shots are required** for all students in Kindergarten and 7th grade. Physical exams are required for all 8th – 12th grade students who are involved in music, speech, drama or sports. This needs to be at the school office prior to the first day of school.

Meet and Greet/Supply Drop-off for all Preschool-5th grade students will be August 15, 3:30-5:30 p.m. You may meet the teacher, bring your child's supplies, and meet the new principal at this time if you wish.

Open House for middle school students is Tuesday, August 15, 3:30-5:30 p.m. You may bring your supplies then. **Reminder, Aug. 15 is a holy day of obligation for the Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary.* The school handbooks, calendar, supply lists and much more are on-line at the **schools' website:**

The **student supply lists** are enclosed. High school students should have a spiral notebook and folder for each class, a three-ring binder and plenty of pens and pencils. Any questions, contact the school office.

Check the **dress code** before shopping and before the first day of school. Only official school-quarter zips & 10th grade fundraiser sweatshirts are allowed.

Water bottles will be allowed. They must be clear/see-through (not colored). Please label them with your name to prevent loss.

St. Mary's Lunch Information (complete information with prices will be coming out in a separate mailing): **Milk and granola bars** will again be offered in the morning. Each milk costs 40 cents, and each bar costs 40 cents. The cost of these will be run through the lunch fund, so send extra money for these if your child(ren) will be taking morning milk and/or a granola bar. Remember, this is **not** mandatory. If your child does not want to drink milk in the morning, don't pay for it. Talk to your child ahead of time about this. Send a note with the younger children. **Milk, granola, and lunch money** may be sent to school any time **after August 1.**


