Dear Friends of Aquinas,


It is great to have the students back in the school. For those of us who work at Aquinas all summer, it's just not the same until you get the energy of the students in the building. The students are our reason for being here. Without them, we are just a building.

One of the biggest changes for the students from summer vacation to the school year is time management. During the summer, things tend to move slower, and there is always tomorrow. Once school begins, the students need to learn to manage their time. Deadlines present themselves every day. Middle school students experience the time crunch to a certain extent dealing with homework, activities and normal home obligations. We limit the time commitment for middle school students by holding all activity practices before the end of the school day. You can help by making sure they have a quiet place where they can do their homework without interruption. You can also make sure that they get a good night's sleep. Research shows that students sleep much better without cell phones, i-pads, etc. Do the best you can with that.

High School is a whole different animal. Students still receive homework but the assignments are usually a bit longer, and some projects and papers are assigned over a number of days. Practices are not only after school but also before school and in the evenings. Students have the opportunity to be in many activities at the same time, and many of our students follow this path. Budgeting their time is very important. Encourage them to get rest. They will want to attend every activity we have. We have something going on six days a week. The kids may not agree with you, but sometimes you have to keep them home. If they keep running and running, they will hit a wall, and that is usually about the time we have mid-terms of finals.

The opportunities we offer students are all good things. The old adage, too much of a good thing may apply here.

## Bus Drivers Needed

Just once, I would like to start the school year without having to beg for bus drivers. This is not the year. Bus drivers are still needed. We currently run five routes in the morning and afternoon. Three drivers are contracted for both morning and evening routes, and three drivers are contracted for morning or afternoon routes only. We are currently covering one afternoon routes with a substitute that will be retiring in October. We need to hire another driver as soon as possible. We pay $\$ 32$ per route, and Fr. Timmerman has offered a $\$ 1,000$ signing bonus for a route driver. Please call Aquinas at (402) 367-3175 .

## Students discover cells, fossils, scientific method

Middle School Science has been settling in to the new year. We do daily Vocabulary practice with Friday weekly quizzes. We started the first two days of school with Station Labs to learn about the classroom layout, rules, the teacher, and each other. As we hit the books, the eighth graders are learning about Cells. We did a Microscope lab to learn how to correctly use a microscope. They are currently working on 3-D models of an animal or plant cell. Seventh graders are learning about fossils. They will be doing a big project displaying the three Eras and 11 Periods of Earth's history. Sixth graders are learning the seven steps of the Scientific method. We are doing smaller labs like "Are you square?" No we are not being rude; we were just measuring if we are taller than our arm span (tall), the same (square), or is the arm span more than our height (wide)? Now we are working on a Mold experiment to see what independent variable will make mold grow the most. We will be working on more labs dealing with graphing, measurement, and then we will

The program features a series of videos offering review and testing strategies in areas of English, Reading, Science and Mathematics. Each video session assigns 10-20 minutes of homework to be completed before the next session. Students are attending JBP once a week during the school day and have been given a log in /password giving the $24 / 7$ access to the material at www.johnbaylorprep.com.

Baylor explains his program as $80 \%$ content, $10 \%$ test-taking strategies and $10 \%$ motivation. Motivated students can expect to see a $2-3$ point jump in test scores, motivation to prepare for their future, and an overall improvement in academic work. A reluctant student will pick up on catchy phrases used and strategies that can improve their academics.
